## 1. INTRODUCTION

**This document represents a form for the formatting papers, so that they are ready for printing and application of this form is mandatory! It is necessary that all articles should be submitted in this form. The paper cannot be shorter than 6 pages (up to 10 pages),** including abstract, charts, tables, images, schemes, attachments and literature. The maximum number of authors per paper is limited to 3, one author can submit a maximum of 2 papers.

The page format is A4, 21 x 29,7 cm (Page Setup, Paper Size). Use 2.5 cm for all margins. Spacing between rows within a single paragraph is one (Single). To format the text, use the Times New Roman font, 11 pt. **Papers should be submitted in English, Russian or languages of former Yugoslavian republics.**

**An example of referencing in the text of the paper:**

One author: According to Brzaković (2016)... or (Brzaković, 2016).

Two authors: According to Brzaković and Maksimović (2017)... or (Brzaković & Maksimović, 2017).

Three authors and more: According to Luque-Martinez *et al.* (2018)... or (Luque-Martinez *et al.*, 2007).

## 2. ELABORATION

### 2.1. Subtitle

The elaboration should be transparent and logically structured with an arbitrary number of subtitles.

Charts, tables, images, schemes and attachments are in black and white or in colour technique; they must contain the title and source, marked with numbers and should be centred.

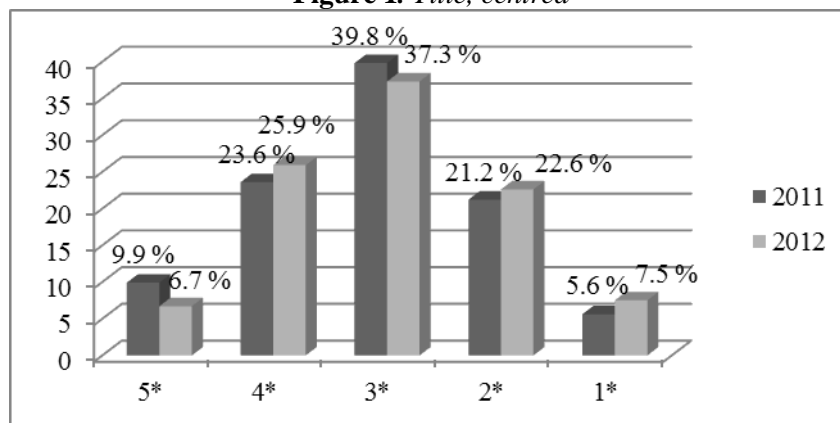
The size of the charts, images, schemes and attachments should be customized to fit the page's format and margins. The same applies to the size of the fonts in the table, so that they can clearly and completely appear on one page. Breaks are not allowed.

References with numbering are listed in alphabetical order according to the author's surname or institution as author. All references should be listed in the paper.

The reference should contain the following elements:

- Surname and initial of name of author/co-author or institution as author,
- Edition year, in parentheses (),
- Title of the paper,
- Name of the publication/conference,
- Name and place of publisher/place and date of the conference,
- Volume and number of publication,
- Pages from-to.
